## **Postal Articles in Large Amount**

## 1. A formal declaration is required for the following:

- (a)Mail shipment subject to Import Restriction List, among which, controlled goods require the approval from Board of Foreign Trade.
- (b)Goods exceeding US\$20,000 in FOB value and imported for personal use. Import Permits are required for clearance if imported by individuals.
- (c)Addressees should fill out a Customs Import Declaration for parcel with a value at or over US\$5,000 to apply for customs clearance.

## 2. Time limit

Declaration of goods imported must be made within 15 days from the date of delivery of Notification Card by the Post Office. A late fee shall be levied for failure to meet the time limit (Re: Art. 68(1), Customs Law).

## 3. Required documents:

- (a)Bill of lading (Parcel List): consignee's name and address must be consistent with those on the Import Permit.
- (b)Import Declaration Form: with duty payer's name and address in both Chinese and English, importer ID and telephone number.
- (c)Import Permit.
- (d)Power of Attorney: needed (with seals of the company head and the company) if Customs Broker is entrusted to make a declaration.
- (e)Price Declaration Form: needed if there are additions or subtractions to customs value , or if importer and exporter are related.
- (f)Invoice or Commercial invoice: with consignee's name, address, commodity name, brand, quantity, specification, unit price, freight, insurance.
- (g)Instruction manual or catalogue.
- (h)Packing list.
